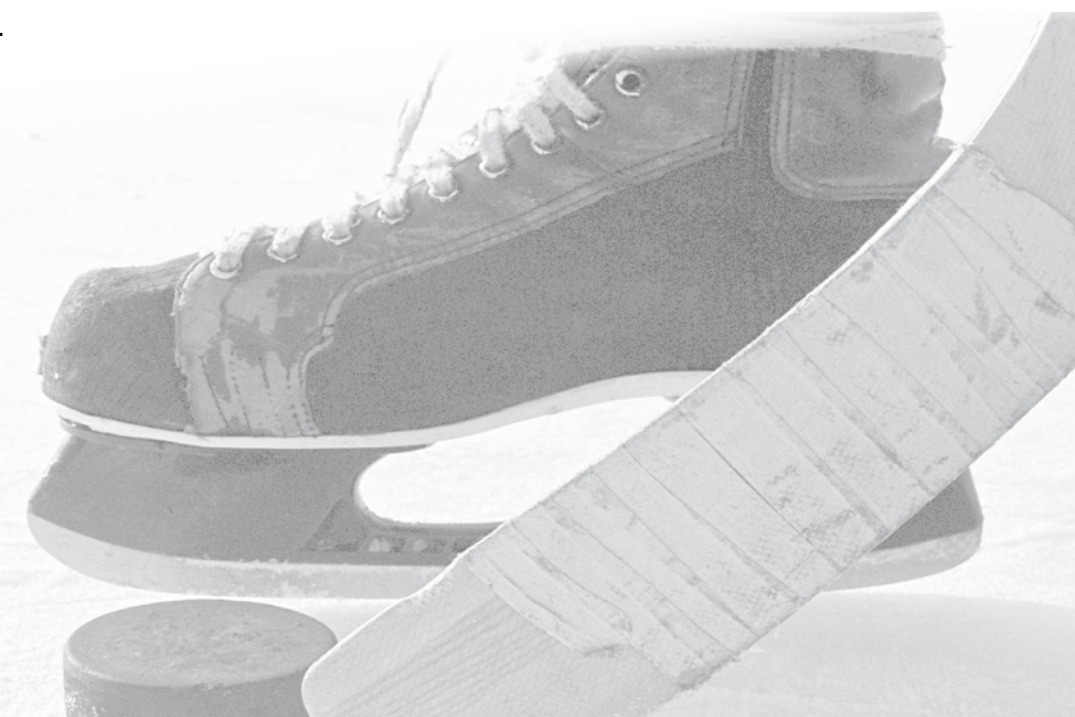
## All New Arrowhead Youth Hockey Summer Program with European Philosophy and Skill Development!

Our goal as a committee and organization is to:

1. Improve the skill of players in our organization
2. Lower the cost and offer more ice time
3. Offer better scheduling to assist families in planning their summers
4. Deliver a consistent hockey message at all levels
5. Offer focused clinics and individualized attention
6. The summer programs are only open to players in our organization. This will allow us to provide individualized attention, with an emphasis on specific skill development.

\* If we don't get enough players in our organization to **SIGN UP BEFORE APRIL 15TH** to cover ice fees. We will have no choice but to offer program to other youth organizations.



## Here's What You Can Expect in the Clinics and Open Hockey Sessions

1. European Focused Skill Development by Mike Watt and his staff
2. Specialty focused clinics
  - a. High school prep for Peewees and Bantams (Incoming freshman are not eligible)
  - b. Girls only focus
  - c. Goalies
  - d. Defense
  - e. Forwards
  - f. Stick handling, power skating, shooting
  - g. Positional play and checking (Peewees & Bantams)
3. "Open Hockey" will be more geared to fun skills and games
4. Same day and time every other week to allow for better family planning
5. Player levels:
  - A. Mini-Mite & Learn to Play (Boys and Girls)
  - B. Mite & Squirt Level (Boys and Girls)

## About the Instructor

### Who is Mike Watt?

After Rink Manager Marv Bednar retired in 2009, the Howard G. Mullett Community Board and Arrowhead High School saw a perfect opportunity to hire an individual that could help take the Mullett Center to the next level. They were looking for a person with a hockey background that could lend support to the AYHA and High School Hockey Program. The country-wide search for such a person ended with Mike Watt in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

Mike comes to us with an extensive European background in hockey, including a ten-year pro career. Mike was born in Seaforth, Ontario and played on the Team Canada U-18 team at age 16. He went on to play left wing for three years (1994-97) with Michigan State and joined Team Canada in the 1996 World Junior Hockey Championship. In the 1994 NHL Entry Draft, Mike was selected in the 2nd round (32nd Overall) by the Edmonton Oilers and played 157 NHL games over five seasons with the Oilers, Islanders, Predators and Hurricanes. After his time in the NHL he played in Russia and Sweden for three years before concluding his career with the Muskegon Fury of the IHL in 2008. Since 2008, Mike has also coached High School and Kentwood Minor Hockey (Youth Hockey) with great success.

Mike, his wife, Nicki, and their two children, Liam and Avery, have relocated and settled into the Lake Country Area.

If you haven't had a chance to see him in action, you can watch Mike on the bench during a varsity hockey game or catch him in the Mullett Center office working to build a stronger hockey culture in our community.
